A BUSY AUTUMN AHEAD!

RUSLAND VALLEY HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY 129TH ANNUAL SHOW.

Despite it having rained virtually all summer, and the severe weather warning for the weekend, Rusland Show was again bathed in sunshine and deemed a sizzling success. Well, they say the sun always shines on the righteous!

Once the small army of helpers had erected and cleaned the marquees, and the entrants had placed their exhibits, the show was a wonder to behold. We have such talent and ingenuity in our community. Particularly impressive were the group entries on the theme of "the Diamond Jubilee", which was won by the Crosslanders.

The craft tent was buzzing with activity all afternoon, while the track and field events, wrestling and fell races got underway outside. In the track races James Thornley from Grizedale showed his competitors a clean pair of heels and won both the 90m and the 200m. Megan Busby won both events in the girls' classes. The ladies egg and spoon drew such a field of competitors that there had to be heats, with the hotly contested final being won by Fiona Evans.

The wrestling classes were won by Jack, Joshua and Joe Threlfall, Ben Brocklebank, Connie Hodgson and Adrian Myers. In the fell racing ,Craig Roberts was dominant, winning both the 5 mile and the short race, and was the first veteran over 40. Particularly impressive was Anna Lupton from Radcliffe AC who smashed the women's record and finished 3rd overall in the 5 mile race and 2nd overall in the short race. The under 17 race was won by Oscar Meanwell from Rusland who also picked up the trophy for the best local performance, and the Under 14 race by Ashley Brindle from Kendal.

There were 31 runners in the Under 12 race, many from Ambleside, who together with their supporters caused the commentator to ask "is anyone left in Ambleside this afternoon?". The race was won by Luke Bowen from Ambleside.

In what is always a highlight of the afternoon, there was a wide variety of dogs of all shapes and sizes in the Pet Show, and the president had his work cut out to judge the dog with the waggiest tail. There were also some hens in the other pet classes who seemed to be enjoying their trip out to the show field.

On seeing some visitors from Merseyside leaving the show field, I asked whether they had enjoyed the show " Of course" was the reply " Rusland always puts on the best show". Well done everyone, see you all next year for the 130th show.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

The next meeting of Satterthwaite Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 11th September at 7.30pm in the Satterthwaite Parish Room.

SPC last met on 30th July when it resolved to adopt the new Code of Conduct to meet the requirements of the Localism Act 2011. Councillors then completed the 'Notification by Member of a Parish Council of Pecuniary and Other Registrable Interests' forms.

Two planning applications were considered: councilors resolved to register reservations about the construction of a zip trekking course in Grizedale Forest and accepted the temporary closure of Part of Bridleway 566017 at Low Dale Park Plantation as necessary for the work intended. The notice for the temporary closure reads: The effect of the order will be to prohibit traffic on foot, horseback and pedal cycle from proceeding over bridleway 566017 at Low Dale Park Plantation, Satterthwaite, between grid references SD 3582 9142 and SD 3680 9246, because of the likelihood of danger to the public whilst timber felling, harvesting and reinstatement works take place. The order will take effect on 6 September 2012 and will continue in force for six months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier. If the works have not been completed it may be extended for a further period with the approval of the Secretary of State. Signs will be erected showing the closed path. Temporary alternative routes will be available for cyclists and horse riders on nearby footpaths for the period of the closure (as shown on the map) but they will return to footpath status as soon as the bridleway is re-opened. Councillors authorized the following order for payment of £400.00 to Satterthwaite PCC for graveyard maintenance. There is still a vacancy for a parish councillor and it was agreed that positive action to have a representative from Graythwaite would be taken but anyone interested in becoming a parish councillor should contact Cllr David Fletcher (Chairman).

A revision of the Community Plan is underway and will be considered at the next meeting.

Councillors noted that a South Lakeland District Council 'Clean Streets' Consultation is on going to the 24th September.

Since the last meeting, SPC has received notice of a planning application to erect a cedar shed as a tool store at Dixon Forest Barn.


LEVEN VALLEY SUPPORT GROUP FOR ST MARY'S HOSPICE

lan Jones at Holehird, where they have vast and well organised archives, has sent the following interesting information: -

The highest annual rainfall at Holehird occurred in 1928 when we had nearly 9 feet. In the drought year of 1933 we had 4 feet, about twice the average in east Kent. CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

I am often asked what the difference is, in the Church of England, between a priest and a vicar and a rector.

Well, I am ordained priest. It is something that, unless I get caught doing something very naughty, I will always be. So if I were to pack in my job and become an insurance salesman or lion-tamer, I would still be a priest and would still be able, if required to exercise that ministry.

Vicar and rector are job titles. My job is to be Vicar of Hawkshead, Sawrey, Rusland and Satterthwaite. Previously I was Rector of Harrington. Nowadays, there is no meaningful distinction between rectors and vicars. In the past clergy received tithes (a tenth part of all the produce of the lands) for their labours. The person entitled to the whole tithes of the parish was known as the rector. The rector was compelled to provide a clergyman to live and work in the parish. In a parish where the rector did not do this himself, he (never she in those days) would appoint a vicar to do the job vicariously. Nowadays, there is no system of tithes, and so it comes down to local tradition. Some parishes have rectors and some have vicars and there is no difference between them.

There is a difference, though, between a Team Rector and a Team Vicar. In recent years it has become very common for parishes to join together to form a team, at least partly for financial reasons. The Team Rector is the senior member of the clergy in a team, who works with one or more Team Vicars.

PAYDAY LOANS - KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

Payday loans are for relatively small sums of money for short periods of time but they attract extremely high rates of interest. People who are already in long-term financial difficulty with other debts, often use payday loans as a desperate way to try and stay afloat.

Most of the Payday lenders have now signed up to a voluntary charter that must be in place by late November. Failure to do so could mean sanctions and the Office of Fair Trading has been given powers to stop rogue money lenders and debt collectors. Here at the CAB we are keeping a close eye on Payday lenders in our area. Help us by letting us know if any of the following commitments are not being followed:

- Clear information on how a pay day loan works and an example of the price for each £100 borrowed, including fees and charges □
- No pressure to take out loans or extend (roll over)

- Making affordability assessments and credit vetting to check that customers can afford to repay
- Setting out clearly how continuous payment authority works, giving rights to cancel and giving least three days notice of recovering payments
- Freezing interest and charges when a customer is in financial difficulty and making payments under a repayment plan Free, confidential advice and help is available from the Citizens Advice Bureau on any aspect of debt, benefits, employment, housing and any other problems.
