WEATHER FAILS TO DAMPEN RUSLAND SPIRIT From the President of the Rusland Valley Horticultural Society. THE BRITISH SPIRIT – KEEP CALM AND CARRY ON!
The Rusland Show is rarely cancelled and the 130th running of this traditional horticultural show and sports day was no exception despite the horrendous weather, which passed through the region last weekend.

Whitestock Meadow, deep in the Rusland valley, is surprisingly quick to drain which allowed the show to go ahead despite the correctly predicted gale-force winds and prolonged, driving rain.

Inevitably attendance was down on previous years but those who came enjoyed a varied programme of exhibits, displays, sports, hound trails and demonstrations. Despite a mixed season of weather, entries in the horticultural sections held up well. The handicraft sections attracted a high standard of entry and children's entries held up well with the number of first-time entrants especially pleasing.

The Sports events were surprisingly well supported with 42 contestants starting, and finishing, the 5-mile race. Other fell races were nearly as testing, especially for some of the juniors who found the whole experience almost too much with one or two slips and stumbles on the steep and tricky descent. The programme of track races had to be curtailed slightly but even the youngest competitors were keen to have a go. The unofficial award for grittiest performance would go to Tom Gibbs who runs for Ambleside. He cycled to the show, came second in the 5-mile race, 2nd in the short senior Fell Race, won the 1600m and ran in the 800m. He also cycled home again!

Mr Giles Wingate-Saul and Mr Barry Harrison abandoned their usual entertaining auction of produce but held a

a successful first come, first served sale instead.

The traditional final event of the day, the tug-of-war took place in sodden conditions and was won by a surprisingly firm-footed team of Lowick Young Farmers overcoming last year's winners Cartmel YFC. They donated their winnings, generously donated by the Farmers Arms at Lowick, to setting up a local First Responders team.

TIPS ON MANAGING DEBT

If you're in debt, don't panic. It can be easy to overspend, get into debt and feel overwhelmed. It's important to do something sooner rather than later, because the problem won't just go away. Here are some tips on how to tackle money problems.

Think carefully before borrowing any more money to pay off your debts – perhaps it is time to get advice

- If you have lost you job or are off work because of illness check to see if your payments are covered by payment protection insurance
- Check if you are eligible for any benefits and tax credits
- Make a list of all the money you owe (these are your 'Creditors'). Don't ignore calls or letters from Creditors but contact them to explain why you're having problems
- List all the income and expenses for your household over the year. Be honest and make sure that the amounts are realistic
- Contact your Creditors, tell them how much you have available and see if you can agree a repayment plan. Make sure to tackle 'Priority Debts' first, these are the debts with the most serious consequences, like losing your home, having gas or electricity cut off, or owing Council Tax. Then deal with the nonpriority debts.

Dear Friends

Sanctuary is possibly not a word in our everyday vocabulary. It sounds archaic, old-fashioned, and conjures up images of medieval abbey ruins, of abbots and monks opening vast wooden doors and offering shelter to those in dire need. So what has this to do with a more modern concept of sanctuary?

Our lives have changed rapidly and completely out of recognition with those of our ancestors, but there is still a huge need and yearning for peace, tranquillity and shelter-space to breathe and reflect away from the very modern stresses and strains of life.

Many visitors, indeed, many people who move to live in the Lake District, would look to the beauty of the fells and the lakes to find peace and comfort. I would like to mention another place - Hawkshead's beautiful and ancient Parish Church.

This little church has stood for hundreds of years overlooking the village, primarily offering a place of coming together to worship to the glory of God. But in addition it has also stood out as a beacon to the thousands and thousands of visitors and people passing through over the years - as a place of welcome and refuge, offering space, peace and solitude for rest and being in the presence of something greater than ourselves.

The many messages left by our visitors - whether prayers for family and loved ones, help for the lost and lonely, for troubled times, thankfulness for blessings, or even just appreciation for an ancient monument - all stand testament to the peace and sanctuary that can be found in the silence, mystery and awe of God.

Maybe the words of a family from York sums it up better than I can:

'We return again and again to this peaceful church, where our grandson was baptized and our eldest daughter loved the peace of this place. May we find the peace at home that we find here.'
