COME FOR A WALK

The next walk will take place on Thursday, 15th September when we will meet at The Woolpack Inn and Café in Eskdale (NY 190 009) at 10.30 a.m. - journey time just over an hour.

There is a £10 "deposit/charge" per car for parking which can be redeemed in the café or pub after the walk; or the café serves breakfast from 8.30 p.m. if that appeals, and then you can leave your car while you do the walk. We will walk up to Burnmoor Tarn via Eel Tarn. Burnmoor is the largest tarn in the Lake District where we shall have lunch. We return to Eskdale by the Old Corpse route and then visit St. Catherine's Church in Boot by the River Esk and follow the river back to the Woolpack.

The walk is 6.75 miles and involves a total of 800 ft. of climbing, mostly at the beginning up to Eel Tarn. When the "recce" was done at the beginning of August it was a bit wet in places and this is not a walk for inclement weather, so if in doubt please ring Hilary Collins on 01229 860312 before 9.15 a.m. on the morning of the walk.

HOLIDAY PROBLEMS ON THE RISE!

Flights that don't exist, hotels next to rubbish dumps and cancelled transfers leaving people stranded are just some of the problems making holidays a misery. Too often people don't get what they have paid for. To avoid your dream holiday becoming a nightmare:

- Choose a provider with an Air Travel Organiser's Licence (ATOL) for security even if the company goes bust.
- Take out travel insurance from the day you book. Check the excess charges on cheap policies and make sure you insure everything you plan to do, e.g. sports.
- If the operator significantly alters your holiday before you go, you don't have to accept and can ask for a full refund.
- If flights, transfers and accommodation are not as described, complain straight away to a rep, and if still
 not satisfied, use the tour operator's complaints procedure.
- If your flight is cancelled, you are entitled to a replacement flight or a refund.
- Travel insurance normally pays better compensation than airlines for luggage problems.
