RAINFALL

Rainfall for July in Dale Park was only 2.84" and there were 22 dry days without measurable rain. August, in contrast, up to the 15th, was 3.72", making August the fourth wettest month of the year so far. The total rainfall for May, June and July was only 5.91" and there were 64 dry days! The rainfall total in 2018 is just over 30" so far. By this stage in 2017 we had had 45" of rain. Stop Press: August is now the 2nd wettest month of the year – it might yet be the wettest!

Invitation to the launch of the Central Lakes Mission Community, St Mary's Church Ambleside, 7th October, 11am. Please come along to help us celebrate working together and to hear more. But in the meantime, in case you are wondering... What is a Mission Community?

A Mission Community is a group of churches, chapels and other meetings (let's call them 'worshipping communities') who agree to work more closely together with an agreed leadership structure. What would that look like in this area?

Every worshipping community – be it a small group of three or four folk who meet occasionally or a thriving congregation who meet every week - from Dunmail Raise in the north through, Ambleside and Langdale and including a good part of the area between Windermere and Coniston down as far as Rusland and Satterthwaite have been asked if they would like to work together more closely. They have sent representatives to a joint group and this group have met and have decided they want to 'launch' this initiative. So what now?

On 7th October at 11am in St. Mary's Church, Ambleside there will be a service to launch the Mission Community. Each worshipping community has been asked to produce a cloth square with their name or something about their community on it. This will be sewn together but left unfinished – in case others want to join us. After this we will have a shared lunch. The local schools will be putting up displays based on our theme of 'Creation'. The Bishop of Carlisle, the Methodist District Chairman and others will come and celebrate or intention to work together. Please come if you can and find out more.
