OUR LOCAL GP PRACTICES ARE ONCE AGAIN UNDER THREAT.

Tim Farron writes: -

Because of Government funding which doesn't consider rural areas like ours, the GPs in Ambleside and Hawkshead have been forced to hand back their contract.

Local NHS bosses are deciding what to do with the practices, but there's a fear that a private company might come in to run them, or worse that services could be downgraded or closed. And it's not just in the Central Lakes where there's an issue. We all know the pressure our GPs are under post-COVID. We all know how hard it can be to get an appointment when we need one, and the knock on effects that has with our ambulance service and hospitals. We need a fair funding arrangement, that

recognises that it's more expensive to run services in rural areas like ours. And we need the Government and health bosses to make sure that the GP practices in Ambleside and Grasmere are safe, and not run for private profit. By signing the petition, we can show as a community the strength of feeling on this issue and help convince NHS bosses and Government to fund services properly

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

Many people are deeply suspicious of Christianity, perhaps as part of a wider suspicion of religion generally. For some people this suspicion can turn into a prejudice against Christianity. And while it would be nice to say that there is no sliver of truth in those prejudices, it is impossible to do so. Sometimes it seems to me that there is more than just a sliver of truth in them- there are great chunks of the stuff. As someone who feels a deep need to defend Christianity, this is most infuriating. If there is no truth in a prejudice, you can just dismiss it as stupid. But prejudice can take a tiny insight and make it into a colossal (and usually mean-spirited) generalization that obscures the complexity, texture and goodness of its object. But it certainly is true that Christians have often propounded an impoverished faith, and have even more frequently failed to live up to the faith professed. Christians have said and done stupid and hateful things in the name of their religion, and continue to do so. And yet, I remain convinced of Christianity's continued relevance today. I even remain convinced of the continued relevance of the church, as a place to discover who we really are and who we really could be. There is so much distrust in the world, so much hatred and violence and cruelty, and most of all so much fear. What the world needs more then anything else is communities of trust and support and love that show us what kind of life is possible. I believe the church should be made up of communities such as these, and remind us of the ultimate depth of existence. Which is good, because we've been given thousands of them across the country and millions all round the world.
